Big Questions Big God. This was the new curriculum that guided the Confirmation class of 2019/20. Between the months of September through January,

we explored the questions asked of those publicly professing faith as Confirmands. "Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce evil and its powers in the world?" "Who is your Lord and Savior?" "Will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his Word and showing his love?" "Will you devote yourself to the church's

teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of the bread and the prayers?" Our conversations were rich and meaningful, or at least I felt they were!

Within our first meeting - I spoke directly to the young people, "If you are here because your parents are pushing you...have a conversation with them and share your feelings about the process." In other words, I view confirmation as a personal act supported by the congregation. Confirmation is just that, confirming your faith - not your parents faith.





The typical class was structured with

a meal - to foster fellowship, a review of previous discussions - to jog memory and emphasize points, overview of theme followed by small group discussion - to provide intimacy and a less threatening environment. If time allowed, which never happened, we would play a fun game, again, just to build community. All that we did had purpose and meaning!


Our class began with 9 students, at the end 7 confirmed their faith. What impressed me was the depth at which the young people were willing to go. Those who served as mentors provided a safe environment to allow for such depth. I have great hope that these young people will live into the vows they took and the promises they made. I also have hope that you as a congregation will live into your vows as well-remember that you promised to continue to guide and nurture these young people in their journey of faith.

Unfortunately, the next opportunity for a young person to participate in the Confirmation process will be in two years. Currently, there are no 7th graders to advance into the process.
